

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

The 1995 school year has started smoothly, and students are already well into the programs of studies which their teachers have prepared for them.

There have been many changes of staff since last year. The most unexpected of these was the appointment of the Principal, Mr Dennis MacKenzie, to the position of Director of Schools in the Bankstown cluster. On your behalf I have wished him well in his new position. A new Principal will be appointed before the end of Term 1 and until then I will be relieving as Principal and Mr Musson will be relieving as Deputy Principal.

Other staff who have left the school include: Ms Martin from English; Mr Murphy and Mr Tedds from Science; Mrs Linsley, Mr McDonald and Mr Abbey from H.S.I.E.; Mr Jackson from I.E.C.; Mr Alfonsi from P.E.; Ms Di Ramio from E.S.L.; and Mrs Cho who retired at the end of 1994. Many students and members of staff were saddened by the news that Mr Phillip Pulsford, from the I.E.C. staff, died during the Christmas holidays after a long illness. Other teachers who will not be with us during 1995 are Ms Ozers who will be spending the year working in Regional Office and Mr Schlosser who will be on leave for the rest of the year because of illness. We hope that both of these teachers can rejoin the school at the start of 1996.

We welcome to the school the following new members of staff: Mr Le and Miss Cadman in Science; Miss

Pacho and Mr Steinmetz in H.S.I.E.; Ms Davis in E.S.L.; Mr Conroy and Mr Sergeant in P.E.; Ms Varlow in Careers; Miss Kostopoulos in Art; and Miss Li who worked with the Languages Faculty in 1994 has now been given a permanent appointment to the staff.

There have also been changes in the school other than changes of staff. The upgrade of classrooms in Industrial Arts and Home Science blocks has been completed; the Languages Faculty has moved into the newly renovated "O" Block; the E.S.L. teachers have joined the English Faculty; a new computer room is being installed in "J" Block; and the school now offers to senior students, in addition to Joint Secondary Schools TAFE courses, dual accreditation courses in Office Skills, Hospitality, Retail Skills and Vehicle Maintenance.

Earlier this term it was my pleasure to represent the school at a ceremony which paid tribute to all the students in the Region who had achieved outstanding results in last year's H.S.C. examination. It gave me great pleasure to read the citations for the five students from this school who received awards at the ceremony.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

Summary of the Minutes of the Meeting of the 9th of March, 1995.

- * Mrs Fernandez was elected President.
- * Mrs Sullivan was elected Secretary.
- * It was noted that the Student Representatives were not present, and that one of their positions needs to be filled.
- 4 Safety and Security Policy was distributed and discussed, in particular: possible intruders; the need to keep students safe; roles of Staff, Students, and School in security; proceedures to be taken in case of accidents and intruders. Gates to the school are to be closed during the day in order to deter unauthorised vehicles from entering the school. Pedestrian gates to be locked during school hours. Students to carry identity card and produce it when asked by staff. School Council was supportive of this system. The possibility of identity badges was suggested, however the present identity cards have other uses, such as library and photocopier uses. The vote on the use of LD. cards was carried 11-1.
- * Mr Trinh generously offered his services to the school.
- * An item from a newspaper on pro-gay literature was distributed


- and discussed. It was pointed out that the books took an anti-vilification stance and discouraged discrimination, but did not promote a gay lifestyle as such, rather they encouraged tolerance. Parents expressed the view that any such books be thoroughly vetted, and be balanced.
- * Quality Assurance is to be examined at this school during one full week in Term II. A special group will investigate the quality of the school and will include the Principal, Mr Skene and at least one parent. The group will talk to students, parents and teachers, and will result in a report. The purpose of Quality Assurance is:
- 1 Improve the School
- 2 Make sure the School is meeting a standard of best practices.
- * Mrs Fernandez offered her time for that week it is important that the parent representative be available for the majority of the time that the group visits the school.

In Memoriam Phillip Hulzford

(1947-1994)



Mr Phillip Pulsford was a teacher in the I.E.C.(Intensive English Centre) at Cabramatta High School from 1989 to 1994. After a teaching career of over 20 years, sadly he died of cancer on Wednesday, 28th December, 1994, in Eversleigh Hospital, at the age of 47.

Mr Pulsford went to Willoughby Primary School, and North Sydney Boys High School. He then graduated from Sydney University in Bachelor of Arts degree. After that he became a teacher at Macquarie Boys High School and the N.S.W. Correspondence School. Later he did a T.E.F.L. (Teaching of English as a Foreign Language) Diploma at

Sydney University before becoming an I.E.C. teacher at Cabramatta High School in 1990. Mr Pulsford taught English, Science, and History in the I.E.C. He always regarded teaching as being the most rewarding job especially at the Cabramatta High School I.E.C. where teachers are respected by students. He loved his students. His way of teaching, combined with his good sense of humour in the class, always made the learning process more interesting for students. Furthermore, he devoted almost every lunchtime in helping students not only with their academic work but also their personal difficulties. Many students from the I.E.C. have realised that some of their achievements would not have been possible without Mr Pulsford's personal assistance. Mr Pulsford also had a good environmental awareness: he always kept places clean and tidy, and he also planted some trees by the side of the school fence.

In addition to his school/class activities, Mr Pulsford also had a special interest in classical music, English literature & poetry, swimming and gardening. The students of Cabramatta High School, especially those who have been taught by Mr Pulsford, will alway remember him as a most humane person, a good friend, and a great teacher.

The School Certificate

The School Certificate is awarded by the Board of Studies NSW at the end of Year 10.

Students who are awarded the School Certificate receive the certificate itself and a Year 10 Record of Achievement.

To be cligible for the award, students have to:

- attempt the School Certificate Reference Tests in English, Mathematics and Science
- satisfactorily complete English, Mathematics, Science, a Social Studies course, Physical Education, Art, Craft, Music and at least one of two electives
- · have a satisfactory attendance record.

What are the Reference Tests?

All students in Year 10 sit for a State-wide Reference Test in English, Mathematics and Science.

The results of these tests determine the quota of grades (A-E) a school is given.

The school will then award these grades to students based on their work during Year 10.

What documents do students get?

Students who are awarded the School Certificate receive two documents: a School Certificate and a Year 10 Record of Achievement.

The Certificate shows the student's name, the school's name and a statement that says this student has met the requirements for the School Certificate award.

The Year 10 Record of Achievement lists each course the student has completed with a grade. These grades give students, parents and employers a comprehensive picture of the student's school achievements.

The Board of Studies NSW will also provide a presentation folder where the School Certificate, Record of Achievement and other school documents can be

What do the grades mean?

The courses are graded in three different ways:

1. English, Maths and Science

The grades in these subjects are based on the school's overall results in the State-wide School Certificate Reference Tests. The school for example may have achieved 20 grade As. A student who receives a grade A next to English is in the top 10% of the State.

The gradings are as follows:

Grade A: is awarded to the top 10% of students in the course

Grade B: is awarded to the next 20% of students

Grade C: is awarded to the next 40%

Grade D: is awarded to the next 20% and

Grade E: is awarded to the remaining 10%.

2. Other subjects (except for General Experience Courses)

In all other subjects, students will receive one of the following grades:

Grade A excellent achievement—

extensive knowledge and understanding of the course content—high level of competence

Grade B high level of achievement—

thorough knowledge, understanding and competence

Grade C substantial achievement—sound knowledge and competence

Grade D satisfactory achievement—

rade D saustactory actions and understanding—
acceptable knowledge and understanding—
basic level of competence

Grade E elementary achievement—
elementary knowledge and understanding—
limited competence.

Các học sinh sẽ được cấp Bằng Tốt Nghiệp Lớp Mười Phổ Thông và Thành Tịch Biểu Lớp Mười. Trong Văn Bằng có ghi tên học sinh, tên trường và lời phê chuẩn đã hội dú tiêu chuẩn được cấp văn bằng. Trong Thành Tích Biểu Lớp Mười Phổ Thông có liệt kê thứ hạng các môn học dã hòan tất. Sư phân hạng này mục dích giúp phụ huynh, và các công ty hình dung được thành quá học tập của học sinh.

Hội Đồng Khảo Thí NSW sẽ cho mỗi học sinh một biả cũng và dep đế lưu trữ Văn Bằng, Thành Tích Biếu và các chứng từ khác.

Sự Phân Hạng ra sao ?

Các môn học được phân hạng bằng 3 cách khác nhau :

1. Anh Văn, Toán và Khoa Học

Sự phân hạng các môn học này dựa vào kết quả tổng quát của nhà trường đối với kết quá kỳ thi Đinh Chuẩn được tổ chức trong tiếu bang. Trong một trường học có thể có 20 thi sinh đậu hạng A. Giả sử một thí sinh đậu hạng A môr Anh Ngữ có nghiã là thí sinh ấy nằm trong 10% thí sinh xuất sắc tòan tiếu bang.

Hạng A : 10% thí sinh xuất sác có số diểm cao nhất

Hạng B : 20% thí sinh có số diểm cao kế tiếp

Hạng C : 40% thí sinh có số diểm cao kế tiếp Hạng D : 20% thị sinh có số diểm cao kế tiếp

Hạng E : 10% thí sinh còn lại

Những Môn Học Khác (Không kể các môn học tổng quất)

Hạng B : Trình độ giới - Khá nang hiểu biết và kiến thức môn học

Hạng C : Trình Độ Khá - khá năng hiểu biết và kiến thức môn học ở trình độ vững chắc.

We all wish her well in her new position. This year the Careers position is being shared by Mr Wilson (Head Teacher Curriculum) and Ms Varlow. Ms Varlow is at the school on Mondays. Wednesdays and Thursdays with Mr Wilson supplementing on the other days. This arrangement is working well and the students seem to appreciate the availability of two Careers Advisers instead of one.

Secondly, Careers has a new home in "A" Block (A2). With the move and Ms Ozer's departure at the same time you could only tiptoe through the boxes for a while but things are now taking shape. The room is fully operational apart from some shelving, racks and noticeboards which have not yet been delivered. Please encourage your son/daughter to visit the Careers Room through the year to research what is on offer for them.

Thirdly, to make sure that Year 12 students are aware of the many opportunities available to them, Ms Varlow has started a Year 12 Careers Newsletter. This will be distributed to all Year 12 students regularly through the year. A copy of the first newsletter is reprinted on pages 16 & 17 so that you can see for yourself the type of information which is available to Year 12 students. If you have a son or daughter in Year 12 please prompt them to follow up any items which may interest them from the newsletter, as it is vital that

they keep their options open for a variety of Careers rather than finding all doors closed to them in January when their results are known.

Beyond Year 10

During Term II all Year 10 students will be undertaking the Beyond Year 10 course. This course is designed to help students to choose the right courses for themselves in Year 11.

Students will be given a number of seminars by Head Teachers about the courses available to them in each Faculty (KLA). During this time they can ask questions about the courses and start to plan a course of study for themselves in 1996.

In addition to this, Mrs Varlow and Mr Wilson will be talking to students in class about how to make their choices. Topics to be covered are "Exploring the Workplace", "Expectations of Senior Students", "Goal Setting" and "Making Decisions".

It is very important that students choose courses that they are able to do, and amongst them those courses which will lead to their future career. There are several vocational courses available to students which will give them credit at TAFE.

There will be a Parent Information Night on the 21st of June. Interpreters will be available. All parents of Year 10 students will bave to attend this night to get Instruction Booklets and Application Forms for Preliminary Courses. This information will not be given out in class.




Year Seven's First Day at High School



During 1994 Home Economics and Textile and Design classrooms were relocated from "O" block to "E" and "F" block as part of a TAS upgrade.



Pictured below is the large composite learning space in "F" block




SPORT REPORTS

Grade Sport Term I




Bernera Zone Team


