Principal's Message

2016 has passed with a rush of excitement, student achievement and school success. Your school is progressive and continues self- improvement and a growth mindset. An example of this can be seen in what the school has done with the NAPLAN results. Once again our school has been identified as high performing and gaining literacy and numeracy growth above National and State levels. The students and school have been congratulated for these efforts. Self-improvement and growth mindset means we want to be even better. Every student was given their NAPLAN feedback individually and then developed a learning plan based on their results. For some it was to have special master classes in a topic, for others it was tutoring provided by the school after hours and other students wanted to increase the amount they read. The Education Minister has announced that students wanting to graduate high school with an ATAR must gain at least band 8 in NAPLAN and if not reached in year 9 more time will be given for this to happen in later years. This creates added pressure to all of our students and the school needs to respond to this. We have looked at our literacy and numeracy programs. We have consulted the school council, school executive and the student body. We need to create a period each week to teach literacy in a systematic and rigorous manner. This is especially in the areas of comprehension and vocabulary development. It will be for year 7 to 10 to begin with and we are developing the programs now. To make the time available for this to happen we have removed roll call and put the time saved into a literacy period. Roll call will be now taken electronically, saving time. The students will start school at different times to accommodate this.

Year 7 and 8 will start a bit later on four days and early on one day. Years 9 and 10 will start later on 3 days and early on two. The table on page 12 better explains the starting times. Finishing times will remain the same. Parents can still drop their children at school at 8.55 and bus times do not need to be changed as there will be supervision available before period one. This is the first step responding to the increased literacy demands being placed on students. I would also like to take this time to encourage you to send your children to the after school study centres where free tutoring is available to meet everyone's learning needs. This term we have welcomed a number of refugees from Syria and I am pleased to see that they have settled quickly and are working exceptionally hard to learn English. A number of students who have been here longer are acting as mentors and all the students are made to feel welcome. Our community is a shining example of positive immigration and how cultures can live together in harmony. Student citizenship development this year has been outstanding. They have taken a lead role in fundraising for others less fortunate, volunteered in the community for charity and as advisors to local government. They have represented the school at community events such as White Ribbon Day and many other school's multicultural days. They have been described internationally as a great example of what the world should be like. I am constantly proud of their achievements and the difference they make in the lives of others. As this is the final newsletter for 2016 I wish everyone a safe and happy holiday.

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE VIETNAMESE

NHỮNG VẤN ĐỀ CỦA TRƯỜNG TRUNG HỌC CABRAMATTA.

Niên học 2016 đã trôi qua với hàng loạt các niềm vui thích, sự thành đạt của học sinh và thành công của nhà trường. Trường của bạn đang tiến triển và tiếp tục tự cải tiến đồng thời với sự tăng trưởng về ý chí. Một thí dụ điển hình cho việc nầy có thể thấy được là nhà trường đã làm được với kết quả của Kỳ Thi Trắc Nghiệm Đọc Viết và Số Học Toàn Quốc Gia (NAPLAN). Một lần nữa, trường của chúng ta lại được công nhận như là một trường có trình độ giảng dạy cao và đạt được sư tăng trưởng về khả năng Đọc Viết Và Số Học của học sinh cao hơn trình độ trung bình của Tiểu Bang và Quốc Gia. Học sinh và Nhà Trường đã được chúc mừng cho những sự cố gắng nầy. Tự cải tiến và tăng trưởng về ý chí có nghĩa là chúng ta muốn càng ngày càng trở thành khá hơn.

Tất cả học sinh đã được trao cho bản nhận xét cá nhân về NAPLAN và sau đó thiết lập một chương trình học tập dựa trên căn bản của kết quả mà các em đạt được. Một số các em phải có những lớp đặc biệt cho từng môn học, còn những học sinh khác thì cần cung cấp người dạy kèm do nhà trường tổ chức sau giờ học đồng thời cũng có những em muốn tăng thêm số lượng thời gian để đọc sách. Ông Bộ Trưởng Bộ Giáo Dục đã thông báo rằng các học sinh muốn tốt nghiệp trung học với Thang Điểm Vào Đại Học ATAR phải đạt được ít nhất là Cấp 8 trong kỳ thi Đọc Viết Và Số Học NAPLAN và nếu như các em không đủ diều kiện nầy trong năm lớp 9 thì phải dành nhiều thời giờ hơn để đạt được trình độ nầy vào những năm sau. Sự đòi hỏi nầy tạo thêm áp lực cho tất cả học sinh của chúng ta và nhà trường cần phải đáp ứng lại nhu cầu nầy của học sinh.

Chúng ta đã kiểm tra lại các chương trình về Đọc Viết và Số Học. Chúng ta đã tham vấn ý kiến của Hội Đồng Nhà Trường, Ban Điều Hành Nhà Trường và Ban Đại Diện Học Sinh. Chúng ta cần phải đặt ra một tiết học trong tuần để dạy Môn Văn một cách có hệ thống và chặc chẽ. Phương pháp nầy chú trọng đặc biệt vào các lãnh vực về sự hiểu biết thấu đáo và phát triển khả năng về ngữ vựng. Công việc nầy sẽ bắt đầu cho học sinh từ lớp 7 đến lớp 10 và chúng ta đang thiết lập những chương trình ngay bây giờ. Để tìm được thời gian thích hợp cho việc học thêm

này có thể thực hiện được, chúng ta đã dời giờ điểm danh và dùng thời gian tiết kiệm được để làm một tiết học cho Môn Văn. Việc điểm danh nay sẽ được tiến hành bằng phương tiện điện tử để tiết kiệm thời gian.

Học sinh sẽ bắt đầu giờ học ở trường với thời gian khác nhau để thực hiện việc nầy. Học sinh lớp 7 và lớp 8 sẽ bắt đầu trể hơn một chút trong 4 ngày và sớm hơn trong 1 ngày. Lớp 9 và lớp 10 sẽ bắt đầu trể trong 3 ngày và vào sớm hơn trong 2 ngày.

Thời Khóa Biểu sau đây giải thích rỏ hơn về giờ bắt đầu học. giờ tan trường vẫn giử như củ.

Phụ huynh vẫn có thể đưa con em đến trường lúc 8:55 và thời gian của xe bus không cần phải thay đổi vì sẽ có sự giám sát trước khi vào học Tiết 1.

Đây là bước đầu tiên để đáp ứng nhu cầu gia tăng thời gian học Đọc và Viết được áp dụng cho học sinh. Tôi muốn nhân cơ hội nầy để khuyến khích quí phụ huynh cho con em mình đi học thêm tại Trung Tâm Học Tập sau giờ học ở trường, nơi có dạy kèm miễn phí đáp ứng được nhu cầu học tập của mọi học sinh.

Trong học kỳ nầy, chúng ta có đón mừng một số học sinh tị nạn từ Syria và tôi rất hân hạnh thấy được các em đã hội nhập nhanh chóng và làm việc quá sức siêng năng để học Anh Ngữ. Một số học sinh ở đây lâu hơn đã đóng vai trò người dạy kèm và tất cả học sinh đã làm cho các em mới đến có cảm giác mình được chào đón thân thiết. Cộng Đồng của chúng ta là một thí dụ tươi sáng về mặt tích cực của người di dân và làm thế nào tất cả những nền văn hóa khác nhau có thể sống với nhau trong sự hài hòa. Sự phát triển về bổn phận công dân của học sinh năm nay cũng đã thực hiện xuất sắc. Các em đã chiếm lấy vai trò lãnh đạo trong các cuộc gây quỹ cho những người khác kém may mắn hơn, tình nguyện làm việc trong cộng đồng cho các chương trình từ thiện như là cổ vấn cho chính quyền địa phương. Các em đã đại diện cho trường ở các dịp lễ hội trong cộng đồng như Ngày White Ribbon Day (gây quỹ hỗ trợ nghiên cứu trị bịnh ung thư) và nhiều ngày lễ hội trong cộng đồng Đa Văn Hóa khác. Các em đã được mô tả trong phạm vi quốc tế như là một thí dụ điển hình cho những gì mà thế giới nầy phải trở nên giống như vậy. PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE CHINESE

校长致詞

学生获得很好的成绩及学校達到美滿的成功,我们甚为兴奮地渡过这二零一六年。贵校在進步中,继續自我改進及有一成长的心態。这可在下例的例子中见到学校在NAPLAN 結果中所获得的成績。学校再度获确認为有高度表现和在阅讀听写及数学增长方面获得超越全国和洲際的水平。恭贺学生与学校所付出的努力。自我改進及增长的心態意味著我们欲做得更好。

每一位学生都收到个別的NAPLAN 結果反饋,然後据此結果而为他们发展一个学习計画。有些就在某議題上加入特別的主导班別,有其它学生获学校提供課後補习,亦有学生欲增加阅讀量。教育部长宣佈学生欲高中畢业而取得入讀大学的学分,必須在NAPLAN 考试中获取八级水平的成績,如九年级时不達至此水平,在往後的日子就会給予更多学习时间而追上此水平。我们所有学生为此增加了某程度的压力,而学校需要对此有所回应。

我们阅过校中的阅讀聽写及数学等項目。我们已咨詢学校理事会,学校行政人員和学生本身等的意見。我们需要每週添加一節課,以系統式及严格的態度來教导阅讀。特別是在理解和词类发展方面。現從七年级和十年級开始发展各项目。为了实現这些項目所需的时间,我们需要除去早上阅讀的时间而将此段时间储起來成为一節阅讀課。欲節省时间将以电子方式点名。

学生将在不同的时间上学來適应此改变。七年级和八年级有四天将遲些上課,有一天早些上課。九年级和十年级有三天遲些上課,兩天早些上課。

以下的课程表更清楚解釋上课的時间。放学的时间與前一样,沒改变。

家长仍可在八时五十五分帶孩子到校,乘巴士的时间 亦不需改变,因在第一節课前将有教师看管学生。

这是回应增加阅讀时间而在学生身上实行的第一步。 我亦在此鼓励阁下将孩子在放学後留**在学**习中心,此 处可替学生免費補习,务求迎合每一学生的学习所需。

Још једанпут наша школа је идентификована као школа која постиже резултате и која показује пораст у успеху из писмености и рачунања изнад националног и државног нивоа. Школа и ученици су добили честитке за тај труд. Размишљање у смислу самопобољшања и пораста значи да ми желимо да будемо чак и бољи.

сваки ученик је добио резултате NAPLAN теста појединачно и онда је развијен план рада заснован на њиховом резултату. За неке то ће бити часови усавршавања одређене теме, за друге је школа организовала додатне часови после школе а неки ученици ће више времена посветити читању. Министар за образовање је најавио да ученици који желе да заврше средњу школу са ATAR-ом, морају да постигну најмање "band" у 8 NAPLAN тесту иако се то не постигне у 9. разреду, даће им се више времена да то постигну касније. Ово ствара додатан притисак на све наше ученике и школа треба да одговори на то.

Ми смо прегледали наше програме писмености и рачунања. Консултовали смо се са Школским саветом, руководством Школе и делегацијом ученика. Ми морамо да одредимо школски час да предајемо писменост на систематичан и ригорозан начин. Ово се нарочито односи на разумевање текста и проширивање речника. Почећемо са 7. и 10. разредом и већ сада развијамо програме. Да бисмо обезбедили време за то, ми смо укинули јутарњу прозивку и то време сачували за час писмености. Прозивка ће се сада обављати електронски, што ће уштедети време.

Да бисмо ово омогућили, ученици ће почињати школу у различито време. 7. и 8. разред ће почињати касније 4 дана и раније један дан. 9. и 10. разред ће почињати школу касније 3 дана и раније два дана. Овај распоред боље објашњава почетак школе. Школа ће се завршавати у исто време.

Родитељи и даље могу да доведу децу у школу у 8.55 и не треба да мењају време путовања аутобусом јер ће надзор бити обезбеђен пре 1. часа.

Ово је први корак којим се одговара на повећане захтеве који се тичу писмености. Такође бих искористила прилику да вас подстакнем да шаљете децу у центре за учење после школе, где су на располагању бесплатни тутори да би се изашло у сусрет потребама свих ученика.

Овог тромесечја пружили смо добродошлицу одређеном броју избеглица из Сирије и задовољство ми је да видим да су се брзо уклопили и да изузетно марљиво раде да науче енглески. Одређени број ученика који су дуже овде преузели су улогу ментора и сви ученици осећају добродошлицу. The year 7 numeracy result was 536.1. This is second highest result in the past six years. Growth is 66.4, which is higher than the state growth of 58.9. There were 80 students or 51.9% who achieved a band 7 or higher (top 3 bands).


On Monday the 31st of October, Year 8 had the opportunity to listen to James Adams' wealth of knowledge about medieval weaponry and warfare.

NSW Constitutional Convention T.O.M

On the 7th of November, the 22nd State Constitutional Convention was held in the NSW Parliament House. Hosted by the Parliamentary Education Office, there was a record number of 150 students present. Over one third of these were from regional schools. The focus topic was referendums and plebiscites.

I was chosen to attend this event after submitting an application addressing a referendum that has been approved. Despite there having been 44 referendums since Federation, only 8 have been carried out. I chose the 1967 Referendum.

Throughout the day, we particularly focused on the 1916 conscription referendum, 1951 referendum (Communist Party Dissolution) and the 1981 Tasmanian power referendum. We were facilitated by parliamentary officers. At the end of the day, 30 delegates were selected by the participants to represent NSW at the National Constitutional Convention, to be held during March next year in Canberra.

I was able to meet and speak to many students of my age who were extremely aware of the Australian political landscape. It was an extremely insightful experience, as the discussion topics varied from issues such as non-compulsory voting and its impact on Brexit to the environment and the Great Barrier Reef.


