Results of Reading Survey – 52 parents completed the survey

- Most parents said they loved reading for pleasure
- What kind of books most read novels/books, newspapers & magazines
- Children like reading nearly 68% said yes
- Reading at home language English mostly
- Parents mostly think students don't read enough
- 37% of children don't like reading, 12% play games on devices
- How can school help with reading range of ideas including book clubs and prizes

- Congratulations on encouraging students to read at home and read in general.
- Reading for pleasure improves knowledge, reading comprehension, and writing results.
- How to encourage reading at home have a home library, rewards for reading books, choice of what to read, role modelling – parents reading for their children to see
- CHS English has a book club for all students to participate in, students in top classes it is compulsory, other students optional, join book club online Google classroom – 2 or more books per term and write a book review.
- Premier's Reading Challenge state-wide initiative is encouraged but not compulsory.
